


#### Respect Life Month

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

Many of you will remember a television show from the 1970s called "Columbo." The then had a resurgence of popularity with television movies throughout the 1980s and 1990s, when I first discovered the rumbled police detective played flawlessly by the late actor Peter Falk. Often in the show, Lieutenant Columbo would leave a room after slyly interrogating a suspect, turn around and utter one of his classic catch phrases: "Just one more thing!"

Well, I am glad many of you found spiritual nourishment last month with the prayers I shared with you. I recently found just one more" for you this week, especially in the light of Mark's Gospel narrative on this 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time.
