## From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

In a few short days, the Christian world will welcome the Savior of all Humankind! Churches will ring out with festive hymns – that no one needs a book – we know the joyous words by heart since childhood. Streets will glitter in lights and décor with more of a shimmer on December 25<sup>th</sup>. Homes will be filled with family, friends, feasting, and most of all faith! Nevertheless, as we gather to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ – the Word Made Flesh Who again dwells among us as one of us – there will be people who will not celebrate – who do not have a reason to rejoice – who simply and sadly do not believe! May one of our prayers this Christmas be that one person that we know (or someone we do not know), who is not celebrating Christmas – will do so this week. Pray that one doubtful heart will melt into joy. Pray that one soul, who feels shrouded in darkness will be penetrated and cleansed by the light that extends from Bethlehem's night into the four corners of the earth. Pray that all human persons realize that we are pilgrims of hope – walking together to encounter face to face and heart to heart, Him, who is the Hope from Heaven, that never disappoints.

Yes, let us spend some significant time on Christmas Eve – Christmas morning – the days throughout the liturgical season of Christmas that extends until January 12, 2026 on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord - to pause, reflect, be grateful, and together with our families – look at the nativity scenes that adorn our homes. Meditate on each figure in the scene, that I hope is in prominent place – not pushed to the side to make room for Santa Claus or Rudolph.

## BLESSING OF THE CHRISTMAS CRIB AND TREE

The prayers may be said by the Father or Mother. In the little procession formed by the children, the youngest is allowed to place the figure of the Christ Child in the manger. The tree lights should not burn until the blessing of the tree begins.

All sing: HOLY NIGHT.

Father: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Father: Let us pray. Almighty, everlasting God, pour down your blessings on this Crib, which we have set up in memory of the Birth of your Divine Son, Jesus Christ (he sprinkles the crib with holy water). Help us to remember, we beg you, each time we look at it, that Jesus came down to us at Bethlehem because He loved us. Let it remind us, too, O Heavenly Father, that the presents we give and those we receive, are given and received in memory of His love. Give peace to our home, O Lord, and peace to the world, so that we may live with our own family and with all men in happiness; through the same Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and rules with you in union with the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. Amen.

All sing: AWAY IN A MANGER, or some other hymn, while moving to the tree.

Father: O Lord Jesus Christ, we humbly beg you to bless this tree (he sprinkles it with holy water) which we have decorated with ornaments and lights in honor of your birth in Bethlehem. Grant that our souls may also wear the ornaments of good deeds; and make the light of virtue shine in us, so that we may draw all men to you. Amen.

All sing: O COME, ALL YE FAITHFUL, or some other well-known hymn.

It is that scene of our Lord's entrance into our human story that must be our focus — not the decorations — not the food overwhelming our tables and stomachs — not the holiday clothes, as beautiful as they are — but the tiny hands, face, and heart of the Child in our mangers.

With a gathering around our nativity scenes at home this week, I found an "old" home blessing for the Nativity that was first published in a Christmas missal from 1951. Like my father, who experienced his first Christmas that same year in 1951 – a 74-year-old blessing can only get better with age! It even comes with song suggestions – an all for one deal! Please take time this week to pray this ritual – sing these songs – and in the silence from the annual chaos, recommit us to the journey of hope that not only begins at Bethlehem, but leads us to Egypt, Galilee, the Cross at Calvary and the Empty Tomb in the nearby garden. The road to eternal life begins anew this Thursday at midnight!

My sisters and my brothers, on Christmas we will pause, once again, before the crib and contemplate with wonder the Word made flesh. Sentiments of joy and gratitude will be renewed in our hearts, as they are every year, while we recognize in this annual feast that it was out of love that the Creator of the universe came to dwell among us. Yes, in being born among us, may the Child Jesus not find us distracted or merely busy. Rather, let us beautify our souls and make our families a worthy dwelling place where He feels welcomed with faith, trust, courage, commitment, and love. May the Blessed Virgin and St Joseph help us to live the Mystery of Christmas with renewed wonder and enduring hope. This week and every week, with Christ by our side, let us rejoice and be glad, experiencing a happy, blessed, and faith-energizing Christmas.! Amen!
