



Celebrating the Sacrament of Baptism

Infant baptisms (for children from birth to just before their 7th birthday) are scheduled throughout the year after weekend Masses. Baptisms are not performed during the solemn season of Lent (between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday).

Before scheduling their child's baptism, parents and godparents should attend a baptism preparation class in person or online. Godparents that are not participating members of St. Leo Parish will have to request a Sponsor Letter from the parish where they attend weekly Mass.

My dear parish family:

We don't have a guest list for the wedding at Cana, that is recounted in this weekend's Gospel on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. There was no photographer taking photos or cameraperson recording like today. Facebook and Twitter – to instantaneously shoot images into the world – was a few thousand years away. We don't even know the names of the bride and groom! Moreover, we don't know why Jesus was there either. Maybe



it was a family wedding since Mary was a guest as well? Maybe it was friends of one of the apostles and Jesus was an acquaintance? Who knows, Mary and Jesus, could have been wedding crashers, but I doubt that. However, after the wine ran out and a potential disaster was about to hit the party -Imean seriously nothing is worse than the wine running out! God help us, please! After the wine ran out (almost!) I bet the people were wondering, "Who is this guy?" Moreover, "Why did he do what he did – turning water into wine?" If people would have had cell phones and e-mail that night the news would have gone around the world in a matter of seconds.

Why did Jesus of Nazareth choose this moment to perform his first miracle? Let's look at his mother. Mary was the one who coaxed her Son into the miracle in the first place.

But why? Why didn't she gently nudge him with motherly persuasion years before? "Son, we're out of wine or bread, make some more for us." or "Jesus, darling, I'm getting the flu, snap your fingers so I can feel better." Although with all these new strains of flu, sickness, and misery, I am sure many of us would encourage that option. No miracles before Cana, why? Because those kind of "desires" were basically self-serving - me, me me. Today at the Wedding Feast at Cana, Mary urges Jesus to help not her, not himself, but others! That's when the miracle takes hold. That's when Jesus' heart overflows, not with wine, but joy and love. He gave to others. Just like when he healed the blind man – caused the paralytic to take up his mat and walk home – fed over five thousand with the loaves and the fish – raised his friend Lazarus from the dead. Jesus offers these miracles and many never recorded - for others. His divine powers that caused these miracles, were not to puff up his own ego, not to act like some magician at a show, not because he wanted a standing ovation and a round of applause. The Lord is miraculous because he cares and he loves others first. Even if they don't realize it yet! I think that's the best part.

I wonder what the bride and groom thought when the guests told them that it was so nice to save the good wine until last? I would hope that word got around the reception that Jesus was the one to thank. I hope the new couple did just that - thanked him. We must follow suit also in our lives today. We have much to give - some are material goods that are right in front of us and some gifts hidden deep inside our souls, yet both are easily accessible and easy to GIVE AWAY to others. Jesus could have clapped his hands at the second Station of the Cross, when the wood of that Cross dug into His bleeding shoulders - even before that after the first thorn pierced his forehead or whip cord slashed open his back. Mary could have been selfish that afternoon in the field and told the Angel Gabriel, "No thanks, Mr. Angel, try some other girl down the road. Joseph could have given into his fear and been more concerned about how people thought of him and go through with his planned divorce. God could have at any time just given up on redemption and started with a new humanity, like a disgruntles architect, whose building design just wasn't up to snuff. They didn't! Because they thought of others first.

What gifts have we received from the Lord? The answer is – countless!! Moreover, our gratitude – the moments we pause to say thank you to God should be just as countless. We need to get lost in saying thank you to God – every day. Thank you for the miracle of my life and that I got up this morning to see another day. Thank you for the miracle of marriage and my family, both of which can never be replaced. Thank you for the miracle of the Church and the faith I profess, believe, and share with all the people around me. Thank you for the miracle of Jesus Christ, who not only changed water into wine, but changed death into life - a life I want to live with you in heaven, God, forever! May these prayer s be ours this week and always.
