





From the Pastor's Desk


My dear parish family:

Please welcome our missionary priest - Father Joseph - this weekend for the annual appeal that goes toward the Church's missionary efforts throughout the world. If you were unable to give an offering at the masses this weekend, you can drop it off in the office or next week in the collection basket.

I have been reflected on the previous popes in my column in the past weeks since the election of Pope Leo in May, but I wanted to take a slight side trip this weekend, as the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ**, also known as **Corpus Christi Sunday**.

Two weeks ago, just before we began the 8:00 mass, I received a phone call from one of my priest friends, who informed me my longtime friend, The Most Reverend Lawrence E. Brandt, the retired Bishop of Greensburg and former Chancellor of the Diocese of Erie, had died at the age of 86. I concelebrated his funeral this past Friday in Greensburg. Bishop Brandt was an amazing man and priest. He served as a diplomat for the Vatican in various embassies all over the world. He was a very learned scholar of canon law and theology. He was a true shepherd and successor of the Apostles as the bishop of our neighboring diocese. I was honored to call him a brother priest and most especially a dear friend.

Bishop Brandt was the homilist at my First Mass at Holy Trinity Church in Ramey on June 10, 2007, now 18 years ago – which was the Feast of Corpus Christi. His homily has stayed with me all these years. As a brief break from our meditations on the popes (and next week we will pick back up with Pope Paul VI – appropriately on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul), I wanted to share with you the conclusion of Bishop Brandt's homily from my First Mass, in which he beautifully elucidates this great and solemn feast of the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Catholic faith! And so, eighteen summers ago, a newly ordained priest (me) and those gathered heard Bishop Brandt words that follow:



"In the Gospel today on this Feast of Corpus Christi we hear of the miracle worked by Jesus multiplying the five loaves and two fish, feeding a multitude of more than five thousand people. Perhaps like the Apostles who felt intimidated by the size of the crowd, and the few resources they had to meet such great need; we may feel perhaps a bit intimidated by the enormity of the needs and expectations which await us each day. Perhaps also you may feel a bit intimidated by the seeming meagerness of the resources you think you have for dealing with these needs and expectations. Be at peace and have great confidence! I think one of the things Jesus is teaching us [priests and lay faithful] by this miracle is that we have to take what little we have and do as much as we

can with it, trusting that God will join us and turn our own meager 'five loaves and two fish' into enough to take care of a multitude of expectations and challenges with some resources even left over. As in the miracle, the loaves and fish only began to multiply when they were being given away. So too with us. The Lord will multiply our own meager resources only when we begin giving them away in service to His people. Be at peace then and have courage! This is why God's will never takes you where His grace cannot keep you!"

On this Corpus Christi Sunday and every day – let us give, as Jesus always does, everything we have and multiply our gifts - His gifts - for others!
