

From the Pastor's Desk

TU ES PETRUS (YOU ARE PETER): *Recognizing the Bishops of Rome since 1846* VIII: *Giovanni Battista Enrico Antonio Maria Montini* (SAINT POPE PAUL VI)

My dear parish family:

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Since this great feast falls on a Sunday this year – it replaces the weekend of Ordinary Time, so we can recall these two great saints, who personally knew the Risen Jesus. Appropriately as we continue to reflect on the popes from our past, we come to a more recent Bishop of Rome many of you will remember, who chose the name of the great Apostle to the Gentiles as his papal name: Paul VI.

<u>HIS LIFE</u> — Born: 26 September 1897 + Elected Pope: 21 June 1963 (age 65) + Died: 6 August 1978 (age 80) – Paul VI was a complex and dutiful leader whose papacy helped shape the modern Church amid turbulent times. A former Vatican diplomat and close aide to Pope Pius XII, he brought deep institutional knowledge and pastoral experience to the role as Successor of Peter. He guided the Second Vatican Council to its conclusion in 1965 (our own Bishop Watson attended the final session), championed global outreach through historic papal travels (including to the Holy Land and the USA), and sought unity with the Orthodox Church. His 1968 encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, reaffirming the Church's stance against artificial birth control, sparked widespread dissent. Despite suffering from continual comparison with his charismatic predecessor, John XXIII, Pope Paul remained faithful to his mission, often torn between progressive and conservative impulses. He decried the spiritual confusion of the era, famously warning of the "smoke of Satan" entering the Church! Beatified in 2014 and canonized in 2018, his legacy is now viewed as prophetic, pastoral and foundational to our present age. Misunderstood during his own lifetime, he is worthy of study again today.

<u>HIS WORDS</u> — "Merely to remain true to the faith is not enough. Certainly we must preserve and defend the treasure of truth and grace that we have inherited through Christian tradition. But neither the preservation nor the defense of the faith exhausts the duty of the Church in regard to the gifts it has been given. The very nature of the gifts which Christ has given the Church demands that they be extended to others and shared with others."

NEWS FROM ERIE — When Pope Paul VI died, a day after the Feast of the Lord's Transfiguration, *The Most Reverend Alfred Michael Watson*, *DD* (1908 – 1990), who served as the Seventh Bishop of Erie from 1969 until 1982, wrote to the Diocesan family in a letter published in *The Lake Shore Visitor* on Friday, Aug. 11, 1978. Bishop Watson said: "In the difficult years, his pontificate faced many difficult decisions, so much so, that many have said that his reign was in fact a martyrdom. Proud of him and his moral leadership, let us be sure to pray for him as for a loved one of our family. We should pray too that the Holy Spirit will guide the Conclave in the selection of a worthy successor."

Saint Paul VI + pray for Pope Leo XIV – pray for us, the Holy Church!

Let us continue to give thanks for Leo XIV and those who served before him, recalling Jesus' words, "Remember you are Peter and upon this rock I will build My Church!"
