


HEY PARENTS! A FEW ANNOUNCEMENTS ABOUT THE SUMMER MONTHS:

From the Pastor's Desk

TU ES PETRUS (YOU ARE PETER): Recognizing the Bishops of Rome since 1846


VI: Eugenio Maria Giuseppe Giovanni Pacelli (POPE PIUS XII)

My dear parish family:

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the 50th day of Easter called Pentecost. It is on this momentous day that the Risen Jesus' promise to send us the Holy Spirit was fulfilled. The Apostles and the Blessed Mother experienced the Spirit's outpouring in a profound way and thus began to preach the Good News of Christ to the ends of the earth. One month ago exactly to this day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit brought the Church an early Pentecost in His guidance of the College of Cardinals to elect a new Bishop of Rome. Throughout the centuries the Holy Spirit has inspired the election of countless men to serve as Christ's Vicar. We are still filled with joy at the most recent revelation in the person of our beloved Pope, Leo XIV. Let's continue this week in rediscovering his more recent predecessors. Now these popes should be more familiar to us, starting with Pius XII.

THE MAN -







HIS LIFE - Born: 2 March 1876 + Elected Pope: 2 March 1939 (age 63) + Died: 9 October 1958 (age 82) -Pope Pius XII was elected pope on the eve of World War II. A skilled diplomat with deep experience in Vatican foreign affairs, he had helped shape Church policy in response to Nazism and Communism. He was Secretary of State at the time of his election. Though maintaining wartime neutrality, he condemned totalitarian ideologies, aided Jews and refugees, and acted as a diplomatic channel between the Allies and anti-Hitler Germans. After the war, he resisted Communist expansion in Eastern Europe and intervened in Italian elections to prevent a Communist victory. Doctrinally, he advanced biblical scholarship and liturgical reform, and in 1950 infallibly defined the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. His critics question whether he spoke out forcefully enough against the Holocaust, though many contemporaries — including Jewish leaders — praised his efforts to save lives. Despite controversy, Pope Pius XII is recognized for his moral leadership during a time of global crisis. He was declared "venerable" by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.

HIS WORDS — "God did not create a human family made up of segregated, dissociated, mutually independent members. No; he would have them all united by the bond of total love of Him and consequent self-dedication to assisting each other to maintain that bond intact.....The faith of the Church is this: That one and identical is the Word of God and the Son of Mary Who suffered on the Cross, Who is present in the Eucharist, and Who rules in Heaven."

NEWS FROM ERIE — When Pius XII passed into eternity, *The Most Reverend John Mark Gannon*, *DD*, *DCL*, LLD (1877 – 1968), who served as the Fifth Bishop of Erie from 1920 until 1966, issued a statement in The Lake Shore Visitor on Oct. 19, 1958. In part, Archbishop Gannon said: "As we look up at the skies tonight to admire the stars of great men on the earth who are doing their best to restore peace, order and good will among the nations of the earth, we deeply mourn the disappearance of the star of Eugenio Pacelli, Pope Pius the Twelfth. The Diocese of Erie has always been present in the mind and heart of the Pope. It is therefore not only with a deep sense of gratitude, but also a profound feeling of grief that we learn of the passing of so distinguished and generous a friend.'

Venerable Pius XII + pray for us – pray for Pope Leo XIV – pray for the Church!

Let us continue to give thanks for Leo XIV, those who served before him, by recalling Jesus' words, "Remember you are Peter and upon this rock I will build My Church!"
