

From the Pastor's Desk

+ I + PAUSE FOR PRAYER THIS MONTH

My dear parish family:

During the last week of August, the Church throughout the world, as we do every liturgical year, observed the feasts of two significant saint sin our tradition – a mother and son – Saint Monica and Saint Augustine. Monica exemplifies the importance or prayer, especially preserving in prayer. Though no writings of her own have survived the centuries, her son, Augustine, undoubtedly the greatest theological mind of Western Christianity, wrote profusely. He talks of prayer in these poetic and thought-provoking terms. He says, "Many cry to God, but not with the voice of the soul, but with the voice of the body; only the cry of the heart, of the soul, reaches God." The wisdom of the saints is such a gift! Another saint – the great mystic and Spanish nun – Teresa of Avila contextualizes the need for prayer this way: "Much more is accomplished by a single word of the Our Father said, now and then, from our heart, than by the whole prayer repeated many times in haste and without attention."

Throughout these final 4 weeks in September I want to take the opportunity to share with you four prayers that you can take time to pause -to reflect - and to connect with God. They are prayers that are not as familiar or "popular" or oft-memorized like the Our Father, Hail Mary, or Grace Before Meals, but perhaps by offering these new avenues to reaching God, they might become for us, more regularly spoken from our hearts.

Let's begin with a prayer I used to have taped on my door at St. Mark Seminary by Thomas Merton.

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you.

And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road. though I may know nothing about it.

Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.
