

BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL. ST. LEO SCHOOL STUDENTS ATTENDED MASS ON WEDNESDAY AND FRIDAY OF THE FIRST WEEK OF LENT AND ATTENDED THEIR FIRST OF MANY STATIONS OF THE CROSS FOR THE SEASON. BEFORE HEADING TO ASH WEDNESDAY MASS, OUR STUDENTS "BURIED THE ALLELUIA". THEY PLACED THE WORD, ALONG WITH THE ALLELUIA BUTTERFLIES THEY MADE, IN A BOX. IT WILL BE BROUGHT OUT AND BUTTERFLIES WILL BE RETURNED TO THE STUDENTS AFTER EASTER! THIS HELPS THE STUDENTS VISUALIZE THIS PRACTICE OF FASTING FROM THIS JOYOUS WORD. IN 6TH GRADE, STUDENTS HAVE A SPECIAL LENTEN PRAVER TABLE. THE STUDENTS CHOOSE A RANDOM CHALLENGE FROM ONE OF THE SCATEGORIES AVAILABLE: PRAYER, SACRIFICE, OR ALMS. EACH CHALLENGE IS WORTH A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF POINTS, AND STUDENTS HAVE ONE DAY TO COMPLETE THEIR CHALLENGE. IF THE STUDENTS ARE ABLE TO COMPLETE THEIR CHALLENGE, THEY CAN THEN PUT BEANS INTO THE JAR THAT CORRELATES WITH THEIR CHALLENGE CATEGORY. AS A CLASS, THEY ARE LEARNING ABOUT AND TRYING TO "DIE TO SELF" AND SERVE OTHERS, WHILE GROWING CLOSER TO GOD.

From the Pastor's Desk

THE SEVEN LAST WORDS OF CHRIST: Lent Meditation Series + Part 3

My dear parish family:

When we meditate, especially on aspects of our faith, we enter into a scene that becomes more real than just reading text on a page. By meditating on the Seven Last Words of our Lord from the Cross is placing us at the foot of that Cross. We can hear the crowd shouting. We can feel the heat of the desert. We can smell the iron scent of blood that is permeating the air from the three men hanging above us. We can see the horror of Jesus' Passion. Moreover, we hear His voice speak to us – not only 2,000 years ago on Calvary, but today as we walk this Lenten journey. Jesus Himself is our "retreat master" this Lent. He is leading us along the road of these forty days with His seven words, recorded in the Gospels. His commentary therefore for us is not allowing us to reflect on His suffering, but also on our own suffering whatever form that takes.


No one suffers alone. When my paternal grandfather was confined to a nursing home in the last year of his earthly life – the cross of dementia weighing so crushingly on his shoulders – one day my grandmother and I were driving to visit him, and she said to me. "Your grandfather suffers. I suffer too!" In other words, she shared in her husband of nearly 70 years' pain. We do this not for ourselves. No, we share in a person's suffering, because we love them! Jesus suffered not for one person, but for all of us. There was one person in particular who bore a significant amount of suffering, pain, and bitter tears for Jesus on that first Good Friday. That was His beloved Mother – our Mother – Mary of Nazareth.

The third last word this week leads us to her......

The Third Word

"HE SAID TO HIS MOTHER, 'WOMAN, BEHOLD YOUR SON.' THEN HE SAID TO HIS DISCIPLE, 'BEHOLD YOUR MOTHER.'"

(John 19:26-27)



Let us imagine Christ's loneliness, as He looks down at His sinless mother, beside young John, His "beloved disciple." He knows how they share His pain and will soon have to cope with His death; but He is not silent. He wants those whom He loves to continue to love and care for each other, as He loves His mother. Mary, one day following her glorious assumption body and soul into eternity, she will then then be Queen of Heaven. Then she becomes mother not only to John but to every man, woman, and child on earth – then, now, and forever! Jesus entrusts her to all of us, so as mothers so wonderfully have done since the beginning of time, will pray for us, guide us, and love us without condition, especially when we feel abandoned by so many or feel that no one can love us. Mary at the foot of the Cross is love and trust in God that can reignite all our hearts!

Centuries after that day on Calvary, the great saint of our tradition and young nun, Thérèse of Lisieux, would mediate and ponder the strength of the Blessed Mother in enduring so many sorrows, noting that, unlike all of us, Mary herself did not have a Blessed Mother to pray with (although, of course, she had her Son). Therefore, let's bring to our prayer this first week of Lent, third question: is there a lonely person in your life, perhaps someone mourning the death of a parent or their spouse or child? Can we step forward this week and offer love and support, as John and the Blessed Mother offered each other? They did this because Jesus told them so. May we do the same.

May the human voice of Christ from the Cross this Lent lead us to the divine glory of Easter morning!
