

# From the Pastor's Desk

# + IV + PAUSE FOR PRAYER THIS MONTH

My dear parish family:

The great French priest, confessor, and saint – John Mary Vianney (1786 – 1859). He would spend at least 11 or 12 hours a day in the confessional during winter, and up to 16 in the summer. One profound moment in the confessional is described in the book <u>Cure of Ars</u>: "A woman told Vianney that she was devastated because her husband had committed suicide. She wanted to approach the great priest but his line often lasted for hours and she could not reach him. She was ready to give up and in a moment of mystical insight that only a great saint can receive. Vianney exclaimed through the crowd, "He is saved!" The woman was incredulous so the saint repeated, stressing each word, "I tell you he is saved. He is in Purgatory, and you must pray for him. Between the parapet of the bridge and the water, he had time to make an act of contrition. (Trochu, Frances (1930). The Cure D'Ars. Burns Oates & Washbourne LTD.)

I shared this beautiful Act of Contrition with you a few Lents ago. Even though Lent is still months away – it is never too late or too far away to experience the merciful love of God, especially to experience it in an unique way in the amazing Sacrament of Penance or Confession. Use this prayer the next time you go to confession, wherever that may be, and also, say it at home or at work whenever you need God's mercy to give you strength. Reconciliation is celebrated on Wednesdays from 4 –6 pm, Saturdays after the 8:30 am mass, or by appointment with me at any time – at any place. I pray that one day, I will have lines like John Vianney and be an effective conduit of God's mercy for 16 hours. I hope that day is soon!

Before you offer this particular Act of Contrition (and the last line is, I feel, the most powerful), here are words from St. John Vianney himself: "My children, your hearts, are small, but prayer stretches them and makes them capable of loving God. Through prayer we receive a foretaste of heaven and something of paradise comes down upon us. Prayer never leaves us without sweetness. It is honey that flows into the soul and makes all things sweet. When we pray properly, sorrows disappear like snow before the sun."

Forgive me my sins, O Lord, forgive me my sins; the sins of my youth, the sins of my age, the sins of my soul, the sins of my body; my idle sins, my serious voluntary sins; the sins I know, the sins I do not know; the sins I have concealed for so long, and which are now hidden from my memory. I am truly sorry for every sin, mortal and venial, for all the sins of my childhood up to the present hour. I know my sins have wounded Thy Tender Heart, O My Savior, let me be freed from the bonds of evil through the most bitter Passion of My Redeemer. O My Jesus, forget and forgive what I have been. Amen.
