Child Abuse Prevention Month- Reporting Child Abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2023 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 5,129 substantiated reports of child abuse. 1,749 or 34.1% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,350 were physical abuse. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. To report child abuse, call Childline at 1-800-932-0313 (anytime 24/7). Priesthood

Question:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

From the Pastor's Desk

THE SEVEN LAST WORDS OF CHRIST: Lent Meditation Series + Part 6

My dear parish family:

When we meditate on the Seven Last Words of Jesus, we gain a deeper insight into the spirituality of the Cross. That is how we must look at and contemplate the Cross – not as a method of torture as the Romans did, nor as a symbol of death or the end. The Cross – the Triumphant and Holy Cross is the starting line of a spiritual journey for the Christian, as it was for Christ on the first Good Friday. In these "last words," Jesus gives us direction to the very end of His earthly life. He is completing His journey to the eternal Kingdom He spoke of in His three-year public ministry, and His words give us ways to love Him and our loving and merciful God – His Father and Our Father – as we stand at the foot of the Cross.

In the dictionary, there is a word – *penultimate* – it means "next to the last." Thus, our journey to Good Friday and the Savior of all humankind uttering His Last Words is nearly upon us. Therefore, we hear the weakened whisper of Jesus say His penultimate word......

The Sixth Word "IT IS FINISHED." (John 19: 30)

What a relief Jesus must have felt when the mission of His Passion, the most gruesome moments of His earthly life, yet the most important task ever assigned on the face of the earth, was almost at its completion. Yet like Jesus, our own life and its mission is clearly not finished.



What, then, will we do with our time left on earth before, God willing, we pass through the gates of heaven that Christ opened for us by completing His mission on the wood of the Cross? What's next? Easter – Resurrection is next for Jesus and indeed for all of us who follow, listen, obey, and imitate Him. Nevertheless, whatever our circumstances or situations are at present, we acknowledge and accept that our journey on earth has an end, as did Jesus Christ on the Cross.

As the apostle Saint Paul reminds us, we "walk by faith, not by sight." It is our faith in the Risen Jesus that leads us to see that our loved ones are called, as we all are, to cross over the waters of death into God's heavenly kingdom. Our loved ones and friends who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, who are born to eternal life now, pray for us while we still await the endless joy and happiness of eternity. Their mission is not yet finished. Our mission is not complete. The Crucified Jesus and Risen One, continues to show us the way.

Traveling the road of faith together with Jesus is just beginning. The Cross that we will soon kiss on Good Friday is not pointing toward Easter. It is not the signpost for the journey *to* Easter. It is the way – the sign – the

doorway to Eternal Life! Finished? Not yet!

May the human voice of Christ from the Cross this Lent lead us to the divine glory of Easter morning!
